




Impact Report 2023

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

Day Spring provides homes and unconditional love for adults with disabilities in need of support. Our residential options include group homes, staffed residences, apartment living with 24/7 staffed support, and family home providers.

Our person-centered services ensure that residents receive the support they need for daily living, access to community activities, and life-enhancing opportunities. Day Spring residential services are funded through the Supports for Community Living Medicaid Waiver. Day Spring advocates for our residents to have dignity, respect, and the right to make choices.

Day Spring's Arts & Wellness program ensures our residents have ample and diverse activities to choose to participate in monthly. This program continues to grow thanks to community partnerships and funding.

COLLEGE FOR LIVING

After years of providing residential and life enrichment services Day Spring found that there was a population in the IDD community that was left behind. These individuals with IDD did not need around the clock support but were also not independent enough to live on their own just yet.



With this in mind Day Spring launched a private pay residential program in 2017; tailored to young adults with disabilities who have the drive and the capacity to live independently someday but need help developing the life skills to do so.

The College for Living is designed to mirror the college experience that many of their peers and loved ones embark on after high school while also fostering independence in a safe environment. Life skills mentors help students develop confidence and the autonomy to determine their readiness for graduating to full independence.



Day Spring has the capacity to serve more young adults through the College for Living Commuter Program. Commuter students have the opportunity to sharpen their life skills and build community without living on campus. Students can elect between full-time or part-time status.

FEATURED STUDENT


